Enjoy some fine **golfing** with magnificent ocean views! Nova Scotia offers dozens of different courses to choose from including seaside golf landscapes, as well as inland forest settings. Here, you'll discover some of the most dramatic golfing settings in Canada. For those who want to golf in Nova Scotia, there are over 60 pubic golf courses, many with stunning seaside views, which cater to all playing abilities. Beautiful Cape Breton is home to the world renowned "fabulous foursome" of golf courses, including public courses and Nova Scotia golf resorts.
